

# ANNUAL REPORT

The school believes in academic excellence and strives to achieve it in all its programs. Several mile stones reached in the year 2019 – 20 helped the flag of Nadergul fly high.

## **1. ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION**

- i. The school is ISO certified.
- ii. The school added another feather in its cap when it was certified by the prestigious IGBC conferring a platinum award, certifying the school on its green activities. This was solely due to the management's drive towards consolidating the green cover.
- iii. The school building is solar powered with 100kws of power generated.
- iv. Several Green Initiatives taken up by the school
  - a. School has appointed student Green Crusaders and DPS Chargers at all levels. They help out in carrying out the responsibilities required by the students to keep the environment healthy.
  - b. Birthday Gardens where children sow a sapling on their birthdays in the school garden
  - c. Tyre Garden -Attractively painted old tyres are used to create boundaries for flower beds
  - d. The value per month concept encourages the children to develop healthy habits like switching off all electrical appliances when not in use. Tips on conservation of water are regularly practiced. The school is a no plastic zone. Other values like responsibility, empathy, gratitude,

honesty , share and care to name a few, help in maintaining a healthy school environment

e. Haritha Haram is celebrated every year where students are given saplings to plant and take care . Each class adopts a plant. On Raksha bandhan day, children tie organic rakhis on the plants and take a pledge to take care of it.

f. Students are encouraged to follow the 3R's and use recycled materials for projects and models .

g. To maintain the happy atmosphere at the pre- primary, the day begins with a warm door greeting, welcoming the children with either a hug or a hi 5. The colourful rooms, the energetic assemblies, the colour days, the spirit of festivals bring in an element of happiness in the preprimary classrooms resembling the joy de vivre of life.

h. The exuberance of these tiny tots carries to the primary classes of 1,2 and 3 wherein smiles and cheers invade the classrooms. Highly participative students and the energetic team of teachers built the strength in these classrooms.

i. Agriculture activity (SUPW) is very popular amongst the students and they grow vegetables, fruits and cereals on the sprawling field expanse behind the school.

## **2. SPORTS ACHIEVEMENTS**

i. Sports form an integral component of the school keeping an element of "HUM FIT TO INDIA FIT" as the mantra. The school hosted the International Yoga Day celebrations with 4000 children enacting a 7 minute Yoga thus etching our name in the India Book of records as the largest congregation for Yoga.

- ii. Keeping the tempo of the last 2 years, Delhi Public School, Nadergul once again, reiterated its stamp at the District, State and National levels in the games of skating, throw ball, athletics, taekwondo, sepaktakraw, chess and archery.
- iii. The school added another feather in its sports facilities with the inauguration of the 6 lane 25 meter swimming pool along international standards.
- iv. Also came the 200 metre running track, the throwball and volleyball courts with the long jump kit and the 100 m dash completing the circuits.
- v. A beautiful world class skating rink
- vi. Tracking the students' progress in both academic and sports is what Delhi Public School stands for. The Individual Student Tracker helping each parent to identify their child's innate talents, is another step in this direction.
- vii. The school hosted the Taekwondo belt exam with more than 550 children graduating to different belts.
- viii. School also hosted the SGF Swimming and archery competitions in the school campus.
- ix. Continuing the tradition, school hosted the 3rd MKs cricket tournament with almost 600 students from 36 schools participating in it and vying for the cup.

- i. The IRP ( Independent Research Program) with the aim of instilling research into young minds is a good platform for the young scientists

ii. With the activity- based teaching implemented successfully in all classes, students of the school have performed stupendously well in all the Olympiad exams conducted. Many students have reached the second and state levels in these exams.

iii. The school academic outreach program in collaboration with international schools gave us the coveted ISA – International School Award by British Council. With a cent percent score, the school is now recognized in the International arena.

iv. Another novel initiative was to add questions from the newspapers to make reading more meaningful .

v. The CHAI – PE – CHARCHA and the monthly debates – add a touch of leadership skill among the students.

vi. The Science Exhibition show casing the latest trends in the fields of Science & Technology.

vii. The monthly spell bees, Language Bees, Math bees, Geo Bees & GK Bees help in consolidating the topics learnt during the month.

viii. The pre - primary students have also done very well this year with many events and programs the notable among them being the Rythu Bazaar, the science exhibition, Halloween day, ...

ix. The students are given a “ 15 books” reading challenge. Those who complete the challenge are given the Reading Champion badges. This year the newness brought in is “A book a month” and “Poem in the pocket”

X) The Digital Curriculum at Pre -Primary level and Grades 1,2 & 3 is well planned and structured inhouse.

xi) Worksheet Booklets in Science and Social Science, have given that extra edge to children
